


Gender of Members



Marital Status of Members



Total Responses: 710

Total Responses: 710

- **51%** of members received some type of treatment or counseling (such as medical, psychological, spiritual, etc.) after coming to A.A.
- 44% of those members who received treatment or counseling said it played an important part in their recovery from alcoholism.
